Pseudonymous data
Pseudonymous data is personal data that has been modified so that it no longer directly identifies an individual without the use of additional information. Even though it has been modified, it is still personal data and therefore subject to the GDPR.

The 8 rights of data subjects

5. The right to restrict processing

There are situations where the right to erasure does not apply but a person can be entitled to restrict the use of data.

Where processing is restricted, a data controller is permitted to store the personal data, but they must not process it.

The data controller can retain just enough information about the individual to ensure that the restriction is respected in future.

4 Data subjects have the right to restrict the processing of their personal data if the data controller no longer needs the data for their original purpose, but the data are still required by the controller to establish, exercise or defend legal rights.
